He would have given you _____ Let's read about this water: Revelation 22:1-4 states: 1And he showed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding from the throne of God and of the Lamb. 2In the middle of its street, and on either side of the river, was the tree of life, which bore twelve fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations. 3And there shall be no more curse, but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it, and His servants shall serve Him. 4They shall see His face, and His name shall be on their foreheads. Let's read what Paul says in 1 Corinthians 10:1-4 about rocks and water: The apostle Paul says, "For I want you to know, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ"

_____ The scriptures tell us that the Word of God is _____. Jesus is the _____, that is why the scriptures tell us in Matthew, "While they were eating, Jesus took the bread and when he given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body. Then He took the cup, gave thanks and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. This is My blood of the covenant which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." Let's look at John 6:30-35, 48-51 "What sign will You perform then, that we may see it and believe You? What work will You do? Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'" Then Jesus said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, Moses did not give you the bread from heaven, but My Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is He who comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." Then they said to Him, "Lord, give us this bread always." And Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life. He who comes to Me shall never hunger, and he who believes in Me shall never thirst. . . . I am the bread of life. Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and are dead. This is the bread which comes down from heaven, that one may eat of it and not die. I am the living bread which came down from heaven.

If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread that I shall give is My flesh, which I shall give for the life of the world."

Moses is given a prophesy about the Messiah: "I will raise them up a Prophet from among their brethren, like unto thee, and will put My words in His mouth; and He shall speak unto them all that I shall command Him. And it shall come to pass, that whosoever will not hearken unto My words which He shall speak in My name, I will require it of him." Deuteronomy 18:18-19 Let's read John 5:46 "For if you believed Moses, you would have believed Me, for he wrote about Me." Jesus reiterates this in Luke: "And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning Himself."

12. This gives a whole new meaning to "Think not that I've come to abolish the law or the prophets, but to fulfill them. For I tell you truly, until heaven and earth pass away, not a single jot, not a tittle, not a stroke of a pen, will disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished. So then, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments (which includes the 4th) and teaches others to do likewise will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever practices and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven." Matthew 5:17-19 Where do most Christians stop reciting the scripture?

13. Let's look at some scriptures that define fulfill! Let's look at Matthew 26:53-56 when Jesus was arrested! "Or do you think that I cannot appeal to My Father, and He will at once put at My disposal more than twelve legions of angels? At that time Jesus said to the crowds, "Have you come out with swords and clubs to arrest Me as you would against a robber? Every day I used to sit in the temple teaching and you did not seize Me. "But all this has taken place to fulfill the Scriptures of the prophets." Then all the disciples left Him and fled.

²⁴ "Do not make yourselves unclean by any of these things, for by all these the nations I am driving out before you have become unclean,²⁵ and the land became unclean, so that I punished its iniquity, and the land vomited out its inhabitants. ²⁶ But you shall keep my statutes and my rules and do none of these abominations, either the native or the stranger who sojourns among you ²⁷ (for the people of the land, who were before you, did all of these abominations, so that the land became unclean),²⁸ lest the land vomit you out when you make it unclean, as it vomited out the nation that was before you." Leviticus 18:24-28.

15. Near the end of Joshua (after Moses dies), he called the people together before he brought them into the Promised Land. He reviewed with them The Lord's dealings with their forefathers and appealed to them to serve God. After Joshua died, for some 300-400 years, the nation did not _____. During that time, Yahweh allowed the Philistines to oppress them. Since they did not wipe out the Canaanites, they actually started to worship false gods and follow the ways of the nations. *We can see here the first example of a nation of God's people that are not under _____.
