3 ABRAHAM TO MOSES

I. ABRAHAM

1. The third Covenant of the Bible is between Yahweh and _____. “You shall be circumcised in the flesh of your foreskins, and it shall be a sign of the _____ between Me and you. Genesis 17. God promised to make Abraham the father of a great people and said that Abraham and his descendants must _____ Yahweh. What does Genesis tell us will happen to those who are not circumcised? _____ Why is this important? Because this covenant will turn spiritual and if your heart is not circumcised, you will be cut off. It will be very important to know the covenant of the circumcision of the heart – remember God teaches physical first so that we can understand the things we can’t see!
2. When Abraham brought Lot out of Sodom and Gomorrah, Melchizedek, king of Salem (Jerusalem and also means peace “Prince of Peace”) brought forth bread and wine: and he was the priest of the Most High God. Here we see the spiritual priesthood appear for the first time. Eventually, God is going to create a physical priesthood that will also use bread and wine. Once again, he's going to create a physical replica of what is in the spiritual world. AND THEN, after God shows us the physical priesthood, He showcases it again by making Jesus the priesthood in the spiritual realm, in the line of what? _____.
- “You are a priest forever, in the order of Melchizedek.” Hebrews 5:6. And what does Jesus use on the preparation night of Passover? _____ for the new covenant – where Jesus will become our Passover, our King and our High Priest. He will be ALL things demonstrated in the earthly “dress rehearsals” that hit the physical realm and then will be brought into the spiritual “line” and realm of Melchizedek!
3. After this he had to take a heifer, a goat, a ram and turtledove and a pigeon and sacrifice them. How old did the animals have to be? _____. How long was Jesus’s ministry before he was crucified? _____. What does the number 3 mean? _____

4. Abraham was 75 years old when he was commissioned by God to leave his family and his country to go to the promised land. He first believed and it was accounted as righteousness. What did his belief then lead to? _____. It is one thing to believe there is a God and another to _____ God. “You believe that God is one. You are doing well! Even the demons believe that, and shudder! But do you wish to know, O foolish man, that the belief without the _____ is _____?”

5. Was not Abraham our father declared right by works when he offered his son Isaac? Do you see that the belief was working with his works, and by the works the belief _____.

And the Scripture was fulfilled which says,; Abraham believed Elohim, and it was reckoned to him for righteousness.” And He called him, he who loves Elohim. You see, then, that a man is declared right by works, and not by belief alone.” James 2:19-24-NT Why does Abraham’s name mean ‘he who loves Elohim?’ What is God’s love language? _____.

6. “Jesus answered him, “If anyone loves Me, he will “keep” (do) My word (what is the definition of Word)? _____

7. So when people ask you, how were people saved BEFORE Yeshua? You can say this: the true Gospel has been and always will be having faith in God and following His commandments in the preparation of the NEW coming _____ of God – which Jesus will be the King. “Thy kingdom come, thy _____ be done”. The word Gospel means “good news”, the Gospel of Jesus is good news because he fulfills something for us that are going to get to!

8. “Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, preaching the _____ of the kingdom, and healing every disease and sickness among the people.” Mathew 4:23

9. Therefore, if Jesus was teaching the gospel before His crucifixion- that means that the gospel is belief, works and repentance for falling short of the _____.

10. This is why Jesus says, “Whoever has seen Me has seen the Father. How can you say, ‘Show us the Father?’” Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in Me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father is in Me; but if you do not, then believe Me because of the works themselves. Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in Me will also do the works that I do and , in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father.”

11. This gospel belief (depending on where you were born in the 6,000 years, included a Messiah was coming or the Messiah had arrived. But the Messiah was never the entirety of the gospel – it includes the kingdom and preparing ourselves for that kingdom through repentance and obedience. So what is Jesus inside the gospel? _____

II. ABRAHAM'S SONS

1. Abraham and Sarah could not conceive so instead of trusting the Lord, Sarah gives Abraham her Egyptian concubine Hagar and they conceived: _____. “He shall be a wild man, his hands against all and the hands of all against him, and he shall dwell in the presence of all his brethren.” Gen. 16:12 Genesis tells us that he will go on to have 12 sons who will be Princes.

2. Not long after, Sarah and Abraham conceive and give birth to _____. Yah states that He will establish the _____ with Isaac in Genesis 17:19 and with his descendants after him. This is the _____.
Therefore we are still in the _____

3. Ishmael and his mother are cast out from the house of Abraham due to Sarah. However, remember- God told Abraham he would bless his descendants (and He does not specify) so this INCLUDED _____. This is why you will see an angel come on the scene and make sure that Hagar and Ishmael have food and water.

4. What line does the Quran follow? Isaac or Ishmael? _____.

5. Who does Yahweh tell Abraham to sacrifice? Why? Remember, there are a lot of symbols or typologies in the Bible that lead up to the grand “finale”. Here we see Isaac is a typology of _____.

6. Just as Abraham is about to sacrifice his son, The Lord provides what?

7. Who do the Muslims teach and believe was offered as a sacrifice? _____
Keep in mind, _____ are blessed through Abraham. “indeed I will greatly bless you, and I will greatly multiply your seed as the stars of the heavens and as the sand which is on the seashore; and your seed shall possess the gate of their enemies. In your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed, because you have _____ My voice.” Genesis 22:17-18
Remember note that throughout Scriptures there are blessings and there are

8. Does Yahweh demonstrate that He loves Isaac more than Ishmael? _____. They are both descendants of _____. However, if you follow the line of Isaac, you will find the _____. This is _____

Let us go a bit further and look at Galatians- in the New Testament to go even deeper as to the analogy of the two women. Galatians 4:21-26 “Tell me, ye that desire to be under the law, do ye not hear the law? For it is written, that Abraham had two sons (Isaac and Ishmael – God is always demonstrating spiritual typologies through EVERY physical story in the Bible), the one by a bondmaid (this realm/Mt. Sinai), the other by a freewoman (New Kingdom/the other realm/Mt. Zion). But he who was of the bondwoman was born after the flesh (born into this planet-physical-this realm/and law on tablets of stone); but he of the freewoman (Kingdom to come-spiritual-the other realm/law on heart) was by promise (what God wanted us to have in the Garden). Which things are an allegory (analogy – God is telling us he’s using the women to explain something else): for these are the two covenants (the two women, Hagar and Sarah – because you are going to see that these mountains are described as women throughout all scriptures!!!); the one from the mount Sinai (this fallen earth/this realm), which generates to bondage, which is Hagar. For this Hagar is mount Sinai in Arabia (it’s in Egypt), and answereth to Jerusalem (the one on this planet) which now is, and is in bondage with her children (because the Jerusalem we have here is on this fallen planet). But Jerusalem which is above (New Jerusalem/Kingdom to come) is free, which is the mother of us all (Sarah/New Kingdom/law on our hearts).”

9. So here we have Abraham’s wives, that we find out in Galatians, AFTER the Messiah brings the Spirit, is a typology of physical Mt. Sinai, where Moses was given the Law. Genesis didn’t explain it this way, because it was before the Spirit. It was demonstrated through physical women and their children in the OT. They all, including Moses getting the law on tablets on Mt. Sinai, played a very transitory role. Eventually, we are going to be able to understand Mt. Zion (Kingdom to come), and the preparation of the law being transitioned onto our hearts. The tablets are from the first covenant (with Abraham and Moses). But the second Covenant of the law, which is Jesus, is a spiritual law placed on our hearts and comes from a spiritual Jerusalem. Remember – Jesus is the 8th Covenant, which takes the law and places it on our hearts!

10. This has been misinterpreted in theology as we are no longer under God’s law (Hagar) but under grace (Sarah). However, let’s dig deeper! We’ve demonstrated that the law was from the beginning and has blessings and curses through obedience and _____. So let’s turn our attention to Jerusalem- it mentions two in the above scripture in Galatians. The one that is (here) and the one that is to come (above/new Kingdom). The one that is, is according to the flesh (Hagar/Egypt). It belongs to THIS _____. The one to come, “Thy Kingdom come, they will be done.....” is free(Sarah/Mt. Zion – free from sin and bondage). Where is this “free” kingdom mentioned in Scriptures? “Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth,” for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a _____ beautifully dressed for her _____. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, “Look! God’s dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be His people, and God Himself will be with them and be their God.” Revelation 21: 1-4

11. Therefore, Hagar represents being exiled out of the _____ into the bondage of this sinful world. The other woman (Sara) represents living freely, in the Kingdom to come, the new Jerusalem/Mt. Zion, according to spirit and not flesh (“I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh” Ezekiel 36:26). The only way back into the Kingdom (Eden) is through _____

12. Let’s look at who was in Eden and who was on the mountain when we were exiled! 13 You were in Eden, the garden of God. Every kind of precious stone adorned you: ruby, topaz, and diamond, beryl, onyx, and jasper, sapphire, turquoise, and emerald. Your mountings and settings were crafted in gold, prepared on the day of your creation. 14 You were anointed as a guardian cherub, for I had ordained you. You were on the holy mountain of God; you walked among the fiery stones. 15 From the day you were created you were blameless in your ways—until wickedness was found in you...” Ezekiel 28:13-15.

13. Let’s look at Matthew 4:5 “Then the devil took Him to the holy city and set Him on the pinnacle of the temple.” We can see here that this was not the Jerusalem on this earth, it is the New Jerusalem which is to come. What is another clue besides the word ‘holy’? Let’s look at Luke 4:1 “Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.” Whenever people are taken ‘in the spirit’, such as Daniel or any of the prophets, it’s to go into another realm. Luke goes on to say that the devil takes him to the holy city as well.

14. Let’s read Hebrews 12:18-29. I want you to be prepped on what this is talking about: It goes back and forth from Moses and Mt. Sinai, and Jesus and Mt. Zion (in the Holy City), in the other realm. One is from THIS realm and one is from the other realm!

III. ISAAC AND JACOB/ESAU (THE TWINS)

1. Isaac and Rebekah have twins named _____. He becomes Edom or the Edomites. He marries into the line of _____ – who were already in the Promised Land! *He gives up his birthright, but still manages to manipulate his way into the Promised Land! Let's see why birthrights are so important!

2. Who is born first? _____ Yet, he gives up his firstborn birthright- he “sells” it to Jacob. “Of whatever use is this to me- a birthright?” Why does he do this? The Bible depicts him doing this over some food. What does the food represent?

_____ “Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust

thereof: but he that doeth the _____ of God abideth forever.”

3. Who gives us our birthright? _____ “But to all who did receive Him, to those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God- children born not of blood, nor of the desire or will of man, but born of God...” John 1:11-13 What do you think children born “not of blood, nor of the desire or will of man, but born of God..” means?

4. Jacob discovers, through a dream, that there is a “portal” in the land that he is prophesied to have (with the ladder that reaches up to heaven – and angels are seen ascending and descending in this place). When he awakens from his dream, he calls this ladder or “portal” a “gate to heaven” in Genesis 28:17. *I believe this is why this land is so important.

5. Jacob goes on to have 12 sons. Eventually, they are named _____

6. Three things I want you to know about the nation of Israel:

a. Judah (this is where the term “Jewish” comes from today- only makes up _____ . And today, it is utilized as a _____.

b. It is told in the Bible that Esau hates Jacob for the blessing he received

c. Joseph is the second youngest of the 12 sons and the favorite of Jacob- he is despised by his brothers and when you read his life story, you can see an analogy of _____.

IV. JOSEPH/MOSES

1. Joseph is despised to the point that his brothers plot to kill him. Yet one brother steps in (I believe it's Rueben and convinces his brothers to sell him into slavery instead). They beat him and sell him to _____
2. Who was Joseph eventually sold to? _____ What analogy does Egypt represent in the Bible? _____
3. NOTE: Where is Hagar from? _____.
4. Joseph moves up quickly in rank (also ends up in jail- this is a long story and don't forget to keep in mind his typology). Israel experiences a drought and therefore a famine. However, Joseph had stored grain for Egypt and tribes heard of this, including _____ .
5. When Joseph's brothers traveled to Egypt they did not recognize Joseph. Yet, Joseph embraces and forgives his brothers and provides food for them. Who did not recognize Jesus? _____ . "For both the One who sanctifies and those who are sanctified are of the same family. That is why Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers." Hebrews 1:11 This is New Testament. Who, because of sin, was Jesus beaten and died for?
6. Long story short, Joseph is reunited in Egypt with Jacob and his brothers and they are provided for and live there. Also, after they all pass, a new Pharaoh comes to power and forgets the Hebrews (Israelites and puts them into physical _____). This will happen again when the False Prophet comes to power— because right now, God's people are scattered in "Sodom/Egypt (you will see these places in Revelation) and bound under the spiritual bondage of organized religions/deception, until the coming of the Messiah. Pharaoh is a typology of _____ . He rules in Egypt, puts a heavy yoke (remember, Jesus says his yoke is light), on God's people and when they want to go into the _____ .

7. Let's read Ezekiel 29:3-9 to see how Pharaoh was a typology of Satan, and even the name Pharaoh has been used in the scriptures to describe Satan!. Speak, and say, "Thus says the Lord God:

"Behold, I am against you, O Pharaoh king of Egypt,

O great monster who lies in the midst of his rivers,

Who has said, 'My ^[a]River is my own; I have made it for myself.'

⁴ But I will put hooks in your jaws,

And cause the fish of your rivers to stick to your scales;

I will bring you up out of the midst of your rivers,

And all the fish in your rivers will stick to your scales.

⁵ I will leave you in the wilderness,

You and all the fish of your rivers;

You shall fall on the ^[b]open field;

You shall not be picked up or ^[c]gathered. I have given you as food

To the beasts of the field

And to the birds of the heavens.

⁶ "Then all the inhabitants of Egypt Shall know that I am the Lord,,

Because they have been a staff of reed to the house of Israel.

⁷ When they took hold of you with the hand,

You broke and tore all their ^[d]shoulders;

When they leaned on you,

You broke and made all their backs quiver."

⁸ "Therefore thus says the Lord God: "Surely I will bring a sword upon you and cut off from you man and beast. ⁹ And the land of Egypt shall become desolate and waste; then they will know that I am the Lord, because he said, "The River is mine, and I have made it.'

8. Moses is born during the 'population control' of any Hebrew, male baby.

9. Moses is also very much a "type" of Messiah, a foreshadowing, along with the 10 plagues being a foreshadowing of the _____ in the end times.

10. Also, Joseph (Jesus's "father") is instructed to take Jesus to _____ and then bring him out of it. Mathew 2:14 "When he arose, he took the young child and his mother by night, and departed into Egypt."

We too are born into an “Egypt” that we must come out of, or should I say “exit/Exodus”. Revelation 18:4 “And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues.” What does this mean spiritually and physically? It means to come out of her _____. And we are going to see what the sign will be between us and Yahweh when the ‘Angel of Death’ is released on the earth as it was in Egypt (Tribulation). Exodus 12:43-1-16 Is the story of how the Lord took them out of Egypt with his mighty hand. The Passover and Unleavened Bread was instituted (BEFORE the law, but was a foreshadowing of the Passover Lamb that will protect us during Tribulation). “It shall be as a sign to you in your hand and as a memorial between your eyes, that the Lord’s law may be in your mouth; for with a strong hand the Lord has brought you out of Egypt.”

11. Just as Pharoah ordered all the males to be murdered, what similar attempt is made on the Messiah? _____

12. Interesting fact: Moses is not informed by God that he is from the nation of Israel until right before the time he is to leave Egypt and go to the Promised Land. What is the Promised Land’s analogy? _____. True to form, the 12 tribes are beginning to wake up as to who they are and why they had the Word of God and why they were tasked with spreading it to the 4 corners of the world!

13. How long does God say His law would last? “O that there were such an heart in them, that they would fear me, and keep all of my commandments always, that it might be well with them, and with their children forever!” Deuteronomy 5:29 “Everyone who practices lawlessness as well, indeed, sin is lawlessness.” 1 John 3:4

14. Included in the Law is Yahweh’s _____ Seven means what? _____ They were given in the law and are ordained to be kept forever. Why? They represent what Jesus is to fulfill: the first four are the _____ Passover (Yeshua fulfills this on Passover and becomes our Passover lamb), The Feast of Unleavened Bread (Jesus is the manna or the bread without sin), First Fruits (Jesus becomes the First Fruits of the resurrected) and Pentecost (when Jesus ascends to heaven, he sends the Spirit). The three that are yet to be fulfilled will be done so in His _____.

15. There is one time that God instructs the Israelites to wipe out another nation and not to spare man, woman, child or beast. This is used against Christians as their God being a tyrannical God and a racist God. However, who are these people already in the Promised Land?

_____ They possibly have the Nephilim blood - remember there were giants in the land after the flood. And these people took the law of sacrifice and sacrificed children. Even today- the satanic cult believes in animal and human sacrifice.

16. Fun Fact!!!! Moses is not permitted to enter the Promised Land- Joshua takes over for him and is the first to enter. What is Jesus/Yeshua's name in English? _____ What is Jesus?
